
If your child is not returning to Bargo PS in 2020, it would assist school planning and class placements if parents could notify the office. In

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

KC and 3/4C have been making great choices on our playgrounds. The students of 3/4C interviewed the students of KC to find out how to be a good friend and how we can be assertive (help ourselves) if there is a problem on the playground. Here are some sentences we wrote after our interviews.

Being a Friend

Friends are really important. Having good friends helps us in many ways. They make us feel happy and like we belong. To have good friends, we need to be good friends. We can do this by;

- •Taking care of our friends. We keep our friends safe by making good choices.
- •We use a happy face with our friends and use a gentle voice and hands.
- •When your friend is sad you cheer them up, maybe by going for a walk.
- If someone is hurt, I help my friend by taking them to the teacher so they can go to the sick bay.

Being Assertive – How to problem solve.
