Kaidyn 1/2E

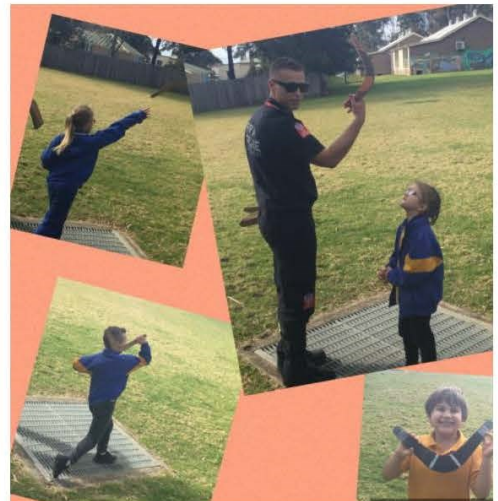
I liked throwing the boomerangs

Sonny 4/5L

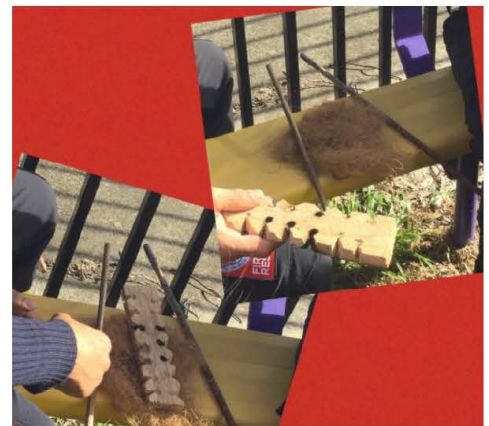
I like cutting out the coolamon
