Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope this email finds you and your family healthy at this time.

Well it certainly has been an indifferent start to Term 3. Before I begin to talk about the current remote learning situation. We have provided in this newsletter a pictorial summary of many events and activities that occur or have occurred at Bargo Public School. We hope you and the students enjoy looking back through these events and photos and it raises spirits. My thanks to the teaching staff who have compiled these images.

REMOTE LEARNING

The transition to remote learning was quick and I thank all families for being able to support the Department of Education guidelines by keeping children at home to minimise movement around the community. I'd like to thank all our staff who transitioned into their remote learning roles with ease and immediate action, providing high levels of support to each other, the students and parents/carers. The COVID situation is always evolving and regularly changing with local government areas being closed and updated restrictions communicated daily. This has an impact of staffing availability and we do have some staff who are unable to work on site. We appreciate your efforts to assist with the staffing of the school by keeping children at home which ensures minimal numbers at school. At this point in time we have structured our school

to ensure:

- All class teachers work from home to support online learners and those learners who are taking photos and posting to Seesaw.
 Seesaw is our preferred platform for learning as our teachers can interact with students by providing feedback.
- A single unit of work is being provided for

students whether they are working online or with paper, at home or at school. Technical support is provided as quickly as possible to families with a designated teacher responsible for assistance.

- Teachers plan each Wednesday for the upcoming week in a designated 2 hour planning time.
- Online planning activities are turned into PDF documents which are then printed for paper packs. A huge task that is completed by staff ready for printing every Monday.
- Home paper packs are printed and ready by approximately 12pm on Mondays.
- Paper packs are dropped off and marked within the week. These packs will be provided to teachers upon return to face to face teaching.
- Students are provided with the opportunity to interact with friends and their teacher remotely via Zoom video conferencing once a week.
- Minimal staff no more than 6 on site (includes teachers, admin and support staff) only to assist with those students of essential workers.



CATCH UP DAY

This coming Friday 13th August will be a designated catch up day for both students and staff. We have been extremely impressed with how students have engaged in their online learning and all that it involves including; posting, approval and giving feedback. Teachers are aware that this is what is required however completing this process online is very time consuming. Our teaching staff are working tremendously hard to attempt to acknowledge and/or mark every piece of online learning. This Friday will give them the chance to catch up on what they may have not been able to mark and it will also give students an opportunity to complete some tasks they may not have completed. Some fun activities may be provided for students to complete at home and school.

SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

As a school we are aware of the strain that home learning may have on families and the home. We have several staff who are working from home while also home schooling. We are using our experiences juggling both to ensure we can support Bargo families in the remote learning process. We are very grateful that parents, family members and carers are ensuring students are doing some form of learning. Please understand we aren't expecting homes to replicate school, nor parents to be teachers. If you are able to support the opportunity for your children to engage in some learning each day that is the what is required. As always if you have any questions or concerns please contact your child's teacher first or the school. There are numerous organisations that we can utilise to support families who may be finding this situation difficult. Please contact us so we can assist and put you in contact with these organisations. Some of the organisations and websites are listed further in this newsletter. 

Premier's Reading Challenge Update

At the end of last term we had 6 students in grades 3-6 who had completed the Premier's Reading challenge. Those students got to put themselves up on our PRC display – "Reach for the Stars". Chosen to coincide with the 2021 National Simultaneous Storytime theme of reading in space!!!!

We have had two students finish the challenge while at home this term – Well Done Gemma K 5/6H and Ella M 5/6H.



Students had until Friday August 20 to read and log their 20 books. We had many students in the high teens that would just have needed another week or two back at school to borrow, read, or listen to books being read to them to be able to complete the challenge – we even sent home lots of new books for holiday reading – but online learning happened!!! We am happy to report that the closing date of the challenge has been extended AND books read collaboratively with teachers online can be included!!!

Adjusted Rules

- The challenge closing date has been extended to Friday September 3rd.
- Students on all challenge levels can read 10 choice books. This means books you are reading at home that may not be on the challenge will be included. This allows for the fact students may not be able to access challenge books from the library or online.
- Students on all challenge levels will be able to include books read collaboratively as a class, in person, online with their teacher or at home with their parents/carer. (This means all students logging in to listen to their teachers read to them!!!)

So to our students in grades 3-6 your task is to go to your PRC page and log in all the books you have read. At the end of last term you should have logged the books read in your classroom to that point, most classes easily reached ten books!! With that already done it is really simple for **EVERYONE** to complete this challenge. You have read the books – you just need to log them. Mrs Shaw will be looking over your files in the coming weeks to get as many of you over the line as possible.

To our parents/carers of students in K-2 classes – your child will complete the challenge based on the books read in class and in library over the first two terms of school. We use so many quality books as part of our teaching and learning program that our students in K-2 finished the challenge of *thirty* books read to them with weeks to spare!!!



Virtual Reality Kits in STEM

Virtual reality in education is on the horizon, and without a doubt, it'll change learning as we know it. Classrooms are becoming increasingly more technologically advanced places of learning, and virtual reality technology will be another way in which students will engage and learn.

We only got a glimpse of virtual reality learning at BPS when Mrs Neill unpacked our "on loan" kits for some demonstration lessons in STEM late last term. These kits need to be returned at the end of this term, but we are happy to report that we have been able to re-book them. The DET T4L unit that loans out this equipment has acknowledged the fact we have missed out on using due to the lockdown. Instead of having to wait for a few years to have them back – we have gone to the top of the list!!!!
